 KNOWN ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, all citizens of the United States, that we, whose names are  
 hereto undersigned, a majority of whom are residents of the District of Columbia, being desirous  
 to form a society and body corporate under the laws of the said District, and in particular  
 under sub chapter III of chapter XVIII of the Code of Law in force in the said District, do  
 hereby declare and certify as follows, that is to say: **DO I AGREE**

- First. The name of the Society hereby formed shall be The American Physical Society.
- Second. The term of existence of the said society shall be perpetual.
- Third. The said Society shall have no capital stock.
- Fourth. The object and purpose of the said Society is, and shall be, to promote the advancement and diffusion of the knowledge of Physics, to publish a periodical and other publications for that purpose, and to do such other things as may be conducive to the said purposes.
- Fifth. The business affairs and concerns of the said Society shall be, during the first year of the existence, managed and directed by a Board of Trustees to be called the Council and consisting of twelve persons, the first members of which council, who shall act and sit until the membership may be changed by an election held in accordance with the constitution and by-laws of the society, shall be:

To the Articles of Incorporation of the Union Security Land Company.
