Contributed presentations in all areas of physics are welcome. There will be no poster sessions. The deadline for the submission of abstracts is Friday, October 7, 2005. #### **Fifteen Student Awards**

Students are encouraged to present contributed papers. Three awards (\$300, \$200, \$100) in each of the following five categories will be presented: Theoretical Research, Experimental Research, Presentation (Speaking), Presentation (PowerPoint), and Graphics. The names for the awards are:

- The Kennedy Reed Award for Best Theoretical Research
- The Margaret Burbidge Award for Best Experimental Research
- The Luis Alvarez Award for Best Presentation (Speaking)
- *The Steven Chu Award for Best Presentation* (PowerPoint)
- The Charles Kittel Award for Best Graphics

Best research will be judged on originality, quality, and impact of work. Best presentation (speaking) will be judged on communication skills and clarity of the message in the spoken talk. Best presentation (PowerPoint) will be judged on communication skills and clarity of the message on the slides. Best graphics will be judged on the artistic aspects of the presentation.

Students and postdocs are encouraged to apply for travel support. Free lodging will be offered to approximately 50 students (double occupancy). Early registration is suggested. See the website for more details.

# Summary of the Executive Committee Meeting

The APS California Section Executive Committee met on March 24, 2005 at the Westin Bonaventure Hotel, Los Angeles, CA. Attending were: Stephen Applebaum, Michael Barnett, Carolus Boekema, Shirley Chiang, Ching Fong, Alan Kleinsasser, Alex Maradudin, Jeffrey Ostrick, and Julie Yi. Among the highlights were:

- Fall 2005 Meeting Program Committee: The Section Annual Meeting was set for October 21-22, 2005 at CSU Sacramento. It was agreed to provide funds to support travel to the meeting and awards for outstanding talks, with a cap of \$3K for each category. Total meeting cost was capped at about \$9K.
- Secretary/Treasurer Position: The vacancy was resolved as follows: Acting Treasurer: Shirley Chiang Acting Secretary: Carolus Boekema
- Newsletter Editor: Charlie Harper was appointed Newsletter Editor. He will put out the first edition of the Section newsletter.
- APS Unit Convocation: Boekema reported on the APS Unit Convocation, held February 18–19 in College Park, Maryland.
- Treasury: The CA Section currently has approximately \$13K in available funds.
- Fall 2005 Elections: More members are needed for the Nominating Committee. It currently consists of Thomas Tighe, and it needs to total 4 members, plus an appointee from Judy Franz. Executive Committee members are asked to locate more candidates.
