March 2006 Meeting Synopsis

This year the March APS Meeting was again a hectic but very successful event. DMP-sponsored or co-sponsored events included five invited symposia and 21 Focus Topics. Of approximately 5300 contributed oral abstracts that were submitted for the meeting as a whole, about 25% were submitted to one of these DMP Focus Topics. These were organized into 120 Focus Sessions seeded by 100 invited speakers. By and large, the Baltimore Convention Center seemed to have been a good venue for all of these events.

During the March Meeting, the DMP presented two prizes. The <u>2006 David Adler Lectureship</u> <u>Award</u> went to James C. Chelikowsky of the University of Texas, Ausin, and the <u>2006</u> <u>McGroddy Prize</u> went to jointly to Honjie Dai of Stanford University and Alex Zettl of the University of California at Berkeley.

The 13 new DMP-sponsored APS Fellows and DMP prize winners were honored Tuesday evening at an elegant reception organized jointly with DCMP. The new DMP Fellows are: **David G. Send your suggestions to the 2007 DMP Program Chair, Jeff Lynn (jeff.lynn@nist.gov), by May 22, 2006 . Following the example in link above, please include a short title, a paragraph that describes the type of abstracts that would be appropriate for the proposed topic, and full contact information for two (or more) potential organizers who are at different institutions. The tasks of the organizers of Focus Topics include evaluating and recommending invited speakers, choosing session chairs, working with other partner units of APS as appropriate, and designating one of themselves to participate in the abstract sorting session in December 2006 at APS Headquarters in College Park , MD. In choosing organizers, please give attention to diversity of perspectives (theory/experiment, basic/applied, university/lab/industry, geographic regions) and honor our commitment to work towards gender balance and encourage under-represented groups. The DMP Executive Committee will evaluate all suggestions.
