

- Some woman has to be the *FIRST ONE* in each department, subfield, program committee, directorship, *etc*
- A classically forbidden state,
- Often meeting colossal resistance




Percent of Bachelor's Degrees Earned by US Women is Rising, but Physics Trails the Pack (1966-2001)

- Very few women professors

- Several post-docs

- Even more undergraduates
- Efforts by women & men are helping some women through the glass ceiling into leadership in some countries


