# 3. Report from BNL Meeting (Zohreh Parsa)

The 89th Semi-annual Symposium was held at the Brookhaven National Laboratory on October 17/18, 2003. The conference, organized by Zohreh Parsa, was truly outstanding. There were 205 attendees, 120 paid at the banquet. (Also, there were four students and the Minister from Israel)The cost of the mailings, food for breaks and banquet fee was \$6,180.00. (Six thousand one hundred eighty dollars and no cents). The cost of the Conference bags, given to each participant was \$1,151.70 (one thousand one hindered fifty-one dollars add seventy cents). The fees collected were \$2,285.00 (two thousand two hundred eighty five dollars and no cents). Contributions from BNL and various contributors came to \$4,477.30, (four thousand four hundred seventy-seven dollars and 30 cents), leaving APS/NYSS a balance (to be paid) of \$568.40.
