3. Secretary/Treasurer Report – Larry Josbeno - See Appendix A

Secretary/Treasurer Josbeno reported that while the finances are in good shape, the Fund Balance has decreased from \$68,000 (?) in 2001, to ~\$40,000.00 today. Prudent spending policies need to be established. Such policies were formed by the Finance Sub-Committee and will be presented subsequently. Michael Stephens, APS Comptroller, has suggested #30,000 as an appropriate Fund Balance. The IRS states that an Organization cannot have a Fund balance of more than two years operating expenses, (for APS/NYSS this is ~\$30,000), and have a tax exempt status. (NOTE: Although we have been above this in the past, we were not in violation of the IRS because we are part of APS National).

4. Proposal to expand membership of NYSAPS (Bob Pompi)

The present membership of the New York State Section of the American Physical Society is 2,221 members. Chair Robert Pompi reported that there are 3971 APS members that live in New York State. To become a member of our Section an APS member has to check the appropriate box. We receive a base of \$1,000 plus \$4.50 per member up to 3% of total APS membership, plus \$3 per member over the 3% (or NYSS that's ~1,500 members). Chair Pompi suggested that we encourage all students who receive finical aid from NYSS join APS as a student member (they can presently join for one year for free), and check the box for NYSS membership. (This was done by furnishing said students was the appropriate forms. Robert also proposed that we send the following email to all members of APS who live in New York State, (we can send one free email to these members via APS national); this would give us more funds for Student Outreach.

This is primarily because of symposium expense subsidies, speaker travel, poster awards, and outreach grants. The Section has been committed to increasing outreach (Our Outreach program was lauded, again at the January 2007 APS Convocation), and our Newsletter expense was both Outreach and an attempt to provide information for our members, and to solicit more embers so we can continue to provide student support and promote physics education, especially in Elementary education.

There are 3971 APS members living in NYS as well as others in surrounding states, so we have the opportunity to grow.

The Section receives a base of \$1,000 plus \$4.50 per member up to 3% of total APS membership, plus \$3 per member over the 3% (or NYSS that's ~1,500 members).

There is talk of increasing the base to possibly \$2,000 next year. The dues are recorded in January.

Appendix B

Report for the Spring 2007 meeting – West Point

NYSS APS/AAPT 2007 Spring Meeting After Action Review

Synopsis: The semi-annual meeting of the New York State Section (NYSS) of the American Physical Society (APS) and the American Association of Physics Teachers (AAPT) was hosted by the Department of Physics of the United States Military Academy, on 13 and 14 April 2007. The theme of the symposium was "Physics in a new Light." The symposium was well attended with 184 registrants, of whom 90 were students – 3 times the expected number of students.

The meeting started on Friday morning with the NYSS APS Executive Committee (EC) meeting. Registration started at noon. The eight lectures started at 1300 on Friday and lasted

until 1445 on Saturday. A conference dinner with poster session took place on Friday evening in the West Point Community Club. Prof. Margaret Murnane who is a well recognized leader in optics from JILA in Boulder Colorado spoke on "Extreme Light." CDT Galgano presented Prof. Murnane with a book on West Point.

The conference was chaired by Dr. Jenny Magnes with LTC Hartke, MAJ Gregory Schwarz, MAJ Keith Haufler, MAJ John Page, and Dr. Mitch Pfenning on the local committee. Many enthusiastic comments were received from the APS and AAPT leadership as well as the general audience on the quality of the talks and conference organization.

<u>Facilities:</u> Facilities used for the conference were Bartlett Hall room 211, the West Point Club Grand Ballroom, the physics conference room (BH302) and the conference room in the Photonics Research Center (PRC). We coordinated for the West Point Club about 8 months out, and this should be done as soon as the conference is approved by the Academy. The West Point Club requires a deposit for each meal that you schedule with them.

Food: We scheduled 4 food periods: Friday afternoon refreshments, Friday Dinner, Saturday breakfast and Saturday lunch. The dinner and lunch were both held in the West Point Club. We were able to get checks from APS made out directly to the West Point Club to pay for the food costs. The number for the catering office at the club is x5120.

Especially, the dinner buffet should be labeled so that people know if they are eating pork, veal, lamb...

Breakfast and refreshments were coordinated through the West Point Club and picked up by faculty. The refreshments were set up in the hallway across from BH211. This was enough room for the 150 guests that we had. We only had refreshments on Friday.

<u>Signs:</u> We did a good job with the signs outside the building, but signs inside the building would have been nice as well. Signs directing people to the restrooms would have been most helpful.

Shuttle Service and Parking: We were able to reserve 10 parking spots on Thayer roof for Executive Committee Parking. Regular attendees had to park at Buffalo Soldier's Field and use the shuttle to the central post area. The shuttle service was scheduled to bring to bring guests to the library corner on the Friday of the conference because of the lack of parking in the central area. We were able to pay for the shuttle from a Physics account, and then get a check from APS made out to US Treasury.

If a shuttle is required after the schedule dinner to return guests to their cars at Buffalo Soldier's Field, then it is imperative to double check to make sure that the bus is going to show up.

<u>Poster Session:</u> We had about 12 posters registered to present, and about 24 posters showed up at the session. The poster session was just prior to the scheduled conference dinner. The poster session was in the same room as the dinner in the West Point Club. We borrowed easels from Chemistry and the foam core boards from the PRC.

We should have been more specific as to the maximum size of the poster. It is also important to allow people to annotate if they will need a table to display anything.

Security: LTC Hartke arranged clearance for post access.

<u>Administration:</u> Submit request through Executive Officer at least 10 months before conference and set date.

Speakers: Speaker selection was completed 3-4 months ahead of time. Some speakers had funded travel such as the dinner speaker and several other speakers. We tried to make sure that the speakers understood that there was a broad audience. Talks were of a broad range and suitable for students, teachers and faculty.

Abstracts from the speakers could have been solicited sooner for dissemination during registration.

<u>Website:</u> The website should be available as soon as possible. There was too much delay. Also, manipulation of the website seemed to run into delays. It would be good if one of the organizers had direct access to the site.

West Point Tour: Having a tour at the end of the conference that is open to conference attendees and their guests/family made the conference more attractive.

<u>Schedule:</u> Having 10-15 minutes built in the schedule for questions allowed us to stay on schedule.

Advertisements: Flyers were sent out about 3 months before the conference. It appears that the mailing list from AAPT needed updating.

Registrants: 184 total. 90 students.

<u>Vendors:</u> We were not able to accommodate vendors since West Point is a government institution. Nevertheless, there was at least one person that solicited for unauthorized sales. It would be good to have a policy in place on how to deal with this situation.

Ethics: There was at least one audience member that made remarks that were perceived as offensive. Also, for this type of situation, a policy should be in effect.
